## PASTOR'S CORNER



### *Pastoral Hunches for 2008*

As a result of planning meetings in 2007, committee work, and a goal setting, I have a few hunches about the year ahead. I'm going to call them "hunches," rather than predictions. Some of these hunches are going to require help and intervention in order to see them come into being. Others are ALREADY developing legs of their own.

Perhaps someone reading these notes will call and say, "John, I'd like to help you with one of your hunches." Which leads to the first of my dozen hunches.

#### **HUNCH #1**

**New people** will step forward to assist with areas of programming, financial planning, program and pastoral support. The time is right for this to happen.

#### **HUNCH #2**

**Our bus ministry** will be resurrected and people will once again be able to get a ride to church for spiritual and educational events offered by our staff. Drivers will step forward to assist, and an attractive bus with "Church of the Roses" lettered on the side will remind people that we are a church in action that cares about people who are unable to drive, or who are environmentally conscious and want to help conserve petro-resources.

#### **HUNCH #3**

**Our music programs** will be enhanced. A chamber orchestra will accompany the Easter cantata, and many people will tell their friends of a newly developed concert series with a catchy name like "Rhythm of the Roses". Our music staff, Barbara and Althea, (and supported by Jeanne MacDonald) and our choirs, will be featured, while local musicians, school ensembles, and groups from within our own congregation will create a new, monthly concert series as people once again recognize the important role our church plays as one of the cultural resources of our community.

#### **HUNCH #4**

A curriculum funding source will be discovered to provide **for future programs of the Ramblin' Roses**. This group will grow and attract new friends who enjoy the overnight camping or day trips to scenic locations in Northern California. These educational resources will be also made available to anyone in the church through the "Rose Room Media Collection" for others who would like to participate in these programs in the comfort of their own homes.

## **HUNCH #5**

Someone will step forward to say, "Ok John, you've bugged me enough, I'll be **the Parish Nurse**. What is it you want me to do?" And I'll say, "Thank you, what about helping us coordinate our monthly blood pressure checks, prescription interactions, and twitches, as well as writing a periodic column for the newsletter?" Someone will say, "I didn't know it was going to be that easy."

## **HUNCH #6**

Last year the church received special gifts - non-budget special offerings that benefited programs, long term debt, and maintenance. One of those special gifts was very substantial and helps me feel more confident with other hunches. I have a hunch that **THREE major donations** will be received at the church next year to do similar work, and I have a further hunch that the number "three" is conservative.

## **HUNCH #7**

**The Montgomery High School breakfast** has continued to increase in size each year. Last year it was recognized by the Board of Education for its contributions in support of the Santa Rosa educational system. A major donation was received last year that will help insure the continuation of this program so long as we are able to staff it. Average attendance in December was a record high of 78 students. My hunch is that there will be several days next year in which that number exceeds 100 students served on a single morning. Further, I have a hunch that people who hear about this important service will come forward to help replace retiring breakfast servers like Jim Reif and Jody Berger.

## **HUNCH #8**

In December, a representative of Restorative Resources came to our worship service to receive a donation from Church of the Roses. She is the first of seven community organizations who will receive mission outreach grants of \$1,000 from our church next year. Other organizations will also send representatives to our church to explain their program and the results that our donations are making possible. (This is in addition to our continued participation in the General Mission of our Denomination and seasonal special offerings and programs.) I have a hunch that these grants that our church is making possible, will increase our impact in the community, the awareness of our church, meet our goal of improving the lives of the people, families and communities that make up Santa Rosa and our neighbors. Further, I have a hunch that someone will step up and say, "John, I'd like to expand the number of **\$1000 'Our Community of Hope Mission Grants' from seven to ten grants in the coming year.**"

## **HUNCH #9**

**Our internet website** which went "live" this year, and was redesigned in November, will continue to receive inquiries from visitors looking for churches and preschools, and that the number of "hits" per week will increase to over 100 unique visitors per week. And I also have a hunch that more uses will be found for our "CD ministry" that makes available low cost or free copies of musical productions of our music department, and important sermons, will grow and become a popular way to extend our ministries and spread the word about our church.

## **HUNCH #10**

New drawings for **refinements in the chancel area of the sanctuary** will make the space more attractive and functional for the wide variety of uses that our sanctuary meets. Our usage ranges from worship, memorials, concerts, to media presentations, church school gatherings, and recitals. Most of these improvements will be hands on projects, but these new drawings will guide our efforts to create attractive, modern and functional upgrades.

## **HUNCH #11**

I have a hunch speakers on local and regional issues will be part of a new speakers program hosted by the Church of the Roses to connect us to the contemporary issues of our area, and provide yet another opportunity to invite others to participate in our discussions.

## **HUNCH #12**

I have a hunch that our relationship with **Beth Ami Synagogue** — with whom we celebrated Thanksgiving services this year — will grow and produce positive results.

Usually there is some basis for predictions. Of course, you know there is. But good stories are often more interesting if they are allowed to be artfully told. I have a hunch that positive things are ahead in the year to come at Church of the Roses. I invite you to be part of God's mosaic.

Tell a friend that the ***Lord is still doing a good thing among us.***

### *Introducing Mike Tucker "Webmaster"*

MIKE TUCKER is the newest member of the staff of the Church of the Roses in Santa Rosa, California. He lives in Josephine, West Virginia. He commutes to Santa Rosa several times a day.

The internet promised us "Community without Proximity," and Mike is a good example. I met him in an on-line interest group where bluegrass musicians exchange ideas, post pictures and music samples, and discuss new products. Mike often posted on the same topics that interested me, and we both own the same brand of banjo.

**COAL MINING:** One evening, Mike told me he was a coal miner. I replied that I use electricity, and some of it comes from coal. What is it like to be a coal miner?

After telling me about his 12 hour days underground, Mike said that he now had a permanent disability. He lives with the constant pain of a work-related back injury. Mining tunnels are four feet high due to the dimensions of framing timbers that hold up the ceilings and walls. Long jagged bolts hang down from the ceilings further penalizing those who stand too straight. So a miner spends his day hunched over, and his back is particularly vulnerable to injury.

"Why did you go to work in the mines?", I asked. He said he had been on a business track, but his daughter was born with a birth defect that required him to get a job with benefits that could help his child. In West Virginia, that means going to work in the coal mines. After a decade of working underground, Mike felt his back give way as he worked to remove a large chunk of coal from a chute. He was laid off for a short period of time with the injury, but felt pressure to return. Six months later, another injury to his back left him

permanently disabled. The company said that because it was difficult for him to sit at a desk for any period of time, they would not be able to retrain him. Mike was released from his job. His wife began a career in computer technology to provide family income. Mike learned computer skills from her, and developed other skills from on-line resources.



**WEBSITES:** After hearing Mike's story, I asked him if he knew anything about website construction. He told me that he created and maintains the website for his local church. I took a look. He does good work. I asked him about creating the website for the Church of the Roses. He agreed to try. We spent hours talking about it over the Thanksgiving Holidays, and we updated information from some work that had been volunteered to us by a church member.

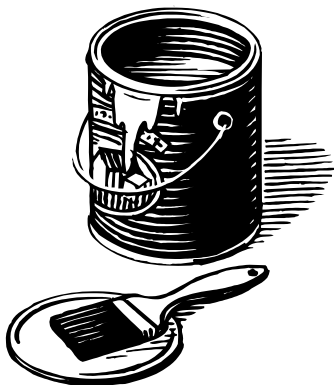
Today our website is up and running and contains a clever mix of current information, photos, our weekly bulletin, and our monthly newsletters. It has all the

registration materials for our preschool, and we have discovered that young families shop the internet first when selecting schools. Mike has been particularly clever with creating graphics, and interesting slideshows and links.

I figure Mike has been working for about \$1 an hour for our church. Start up is time intensive. We plan to increase his wages. I have also introduced Mike to my friends at Music Link, importers of musical instruments. He will be doing contract work for them too.

Welcome to our staff, Mike. Josephine, West Virginia, is a long commute by automobile, but as the electrons fly, it's just down the hall.

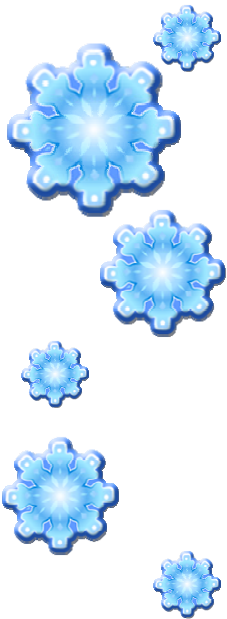
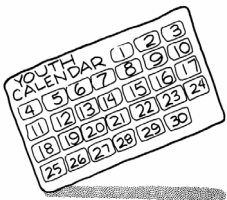
LOOKING AHEAD:



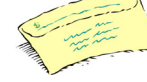

# MISSIONARY NEWS

## A Word from the Morgan's



When Dr. Cynthia Morgan visited at Church of the Roses last winter we could not know how much their lives would change before the year would end. They are now in Houston, Texas rather than Bangladesh. She and her husband Dr. Leslie Morgan are now serving as medical mission advisors to the PC (USA) as they care for their son Everett in his fight with cancer. He is undergoing a third cycle of chemotherapy and the good news is that the tumor in his pelvic bone is shrinking.

Below is a quote from Leslie Morgan's most recent letter:

"Tomorrow as the church begins its season of hope--the celebration of the Advent and Incarnation of Christ, the Savior of the world--our hope is that God will use the doctors, nurses, and medicines of the MD Anderson Cancer Center to save our son. Every night at bedtime, we place our hands on Everett and pray that God will touch him with his healing power and remove every last cancer cell from his body. That is what Advent is about: the hope of real differences made manifest in people's lives. Our years of directly facing human suffering in Bangladesh and now our experience in caring for our seriously ill child, have taught Cindy and me that Christian hope is not about the fulfillment of vague and obscure desires. Hope, like the Incarnation, is about flesh and blood, things we can see with our eyes and touch with our hands; and in Christ, God invites us to hope and pray in those concrete terms. For that is how he cares for his people."


