Merry Advent/Christmas/Epiphany and Happy New Year 2019!

The word, "Advent" means "arrival." Can you believe the year is nearly past and the Advent season has arrived? In the Bible the Advent referred to the arrival of Jesus that John the Baptist declared when he said, "Prepare the way of the Lord!"

Jesus' was about to launch his ministry. So John wanted all the people to be prepared to welcome and follow him. Earlier in history, Isaiah predicted that something new would happen, too. The way of Jesus is like new streams of living water running through a wasteland.

"See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland." (Isaiah 43:19)

Are you prepared to follow the new streams of living water? You may think: "Of course, I'm prepared! This happens every year!"Or does it? Is Advent/Christmas the same year after year or does it change? Hopefully, your faith is still growing so Advent/Christmas is not the same year after year. The meaning of Advent feels deeper and more wondrous as the years and your faith life progresses.

Together let's look for something new to be revealed this Advent. Something **powerful**, **miraculous**, **and loving**. Jesus embodied all three of these when he arrived in Bethlehem. **Powerful** in his supernatural God-given ways of healing and bringing peace. **Miraculous** in the way he fulfilled the prophecies and came to earth by way of the tender loving care of a young virgin named Mary. And Jesus was born to be **especially loving**. No one can love as deeply or as profoundly, but we are called to try.

Jesus came with a purpose to show us "the Way" that recognizes our pain and uncertainties in life are difficult, but he assures us that the negative forces will not destroy us. Jesus came to love us even when we are so afraid of change that it paralyzes and stifles growth. Jesus came because he knew we needed a shepherd to guide us to change in order to go deeper into the journey of faith in God.

The biggest obstacle to change is fear. We can come up with hundreds of reasons NOT to do something new to attract people and to grow the church. When fear guides us there is disunity due to paranoia, low energy and stifled creativity due to repeating old habits. Both of these conditions can threaten personal health and the health of the church as a result.

Some of the new things happening at PCOR are: Our new script writer, Bajun, on staff now for Sunday worship slideshow preparation. The hiring of our talented new choir director, Myles Ellis. The new carpet and the new paint has resulted in an increase of facility use by many outside groups. These groups are waiting for us to welcome and invite them to be a part of our church in other ways, too.

Let's welcome new things, new people, and new ideas to keep the church and ourselves healthy this season! Don't let fear or insecurity stop you from trying new things. Believe in yourself. Do what you love. And most importantly, be kind to others, even if you don't know them. Change is inevitable in every system that is growing. So welcome change, welcome Advent, welcome the holiday season and welcome strangers into your life this Christmastime. They just might be angels in disguise, waiting for your welcome so they can bless you. Here is an Advent prayer that acknowledges the joy and the trepidation in the holiday season:



"A Prayer for Peace & Joy at Christmas"

Emmanuel, Lord of Lord, Prince of Peace, in a season when every heart should be happy and light, many of us are struggling with the heaviness of life—burdens that steal the joy right out of our stockings. Unexpected tragedy arrives and innocent victims suffer: from fires, illnesses, depression, and poverty.

We need your peace, Jesus. We confess that our hearts are too often filled with wonder of a different kind: wondering when the b ills will be paid, when the fears will stop, when healing and rest will come. Is your message of Peace on Earth still true?

In a world where worry, not peace, prevails, stir up that good news again. This Advent, make it real in our hearts. Never have we needed your joy and peace more than now. We need our Messiah!

Thank You for the gift of Jesus, our Shepherd, the Word made flesh. We not only need Your peace and joy; Lord, we crave it. You've promised rest for the weary, victory for the battle-scarred, peace for the anxious, and acceptance for the broken hearted—not just at Advent, but every day of every year.

Your name is still called "Wonderful," "Counselor," "Mighty God," "Everlasting Father," and "Prince of Peace." Be our Savior and save us from ourselves.

We know that peace on earth can only come when hearts find peace with You. You are still our Joy. You are still our Peace. You are no longer a babe in the manger. You are Lord of lords and King of kings. We are thankful we can still celebrate You as our Lord—this Christmas and always.







Each year the Deacons organize two programs to help people in our community. This year (with your help), the Deacons will be hosting a Giving Tree decorated with 50 hearts – (25 adults & 25 children). In case you can't or don't want to shop and wrap a gift, cards will also be on the tree to provide for an opportunity to make cash contributions to the Deacons to use for gift cards or other needs.




