From the Pastor

Celebrate the 500th Anniversary of the Protestant Reformation by Tithing 10% to the Church of the Roses!

Thanks out in Santa Rosa Support! during the fires and in the aftermath as

a shining beacon of hope in the midst of the smoke and chaos. Let us do all we can to sustain and upgrade our church during this anniversary year of our protestant reformation. It is a perfect time to focus your giving and serving on our church so we can continue to give to the surrounding community in this important time of need.

This quote from our PCUSA Mission foundation connects our history with social justice education while honoring the command to love our neighbors:

"As Christians, our faith began with the followers of Jesus. But the beginning of our Christian faith as Presbyterian is in the Reformation. The Reformation marks something significant for us in this part of the universal church: the coalescence of our focus on the Holy Spirit's ongoing reform of us as a church and as individuals. Martin Luther helps us to understand and acknowledge that the institution of the church is not equal to God. We are called to worship the triune God alone, to claim Jesus Christ as Lord of the church, and to seek the ongoing sanctification of the Holy Spirit.

The Spirit of the Reformation has drawn Reformed congregations into social justice. There is not a square inch of this world that does not belong to God and that God does not love. Presbyterians have long been marked by a passion for and commitment to education for just this reason. Learning how God's world works is an opportunity for praise. Learning about unjust, sinful situations and systems that could be righted and healed is an opportunity for glorifying God by honoring the commandments to love God and neighbor."

I challenge each of you to ponder: Why has God put you on earth and why are you still here? I now believe my "call" to be a pastor in Santa Rosa was based on God's providence knowing my social justice education and pastoral care disaster response experience would be used well when the firestorm came.

My family has a long history of tithing 10% to the church even when my mother's family lived below the poverty line. Please consider obeying God's command to tithe10% of your first fruits for the Lord this year so that our church's many expanding ministries will be valuable to the whole Santa Rosa community for years to come. The healing from the fires will take many years and we want to be an important part of that healing process for all affected.

Billy Graham once said,

"Remember this—you can't serve God and Money, but you can serve God with money."

It is also good to recall God's command in *Malachi 3: 10-12: "Bring the full tithe* into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. And thereby put me to the test, says the Lord of hosts, if I will not open the windows of heaven for you and pour down for you a blessing until there is no more need."

Many people in our community continue to need us. Our Church and World committee is giving out thousands of dollars of disaster relief funds to the most needy in our church family and beyond thanks to the generous contributions we have been given. Let's continue to do all we can to be the shining beacon of hope for Santa Rosa far into the future.

A Church of the Roses Tradition

Christmas is the season of giving. Each year the Deacons organize the Christmas Food Basket and Giving Tree programs to help needy people in our community.

This year the Deacons (with your help) will be assisting the YWCA in their program to provide Christmas presents for abused spouses and children. The YWCA runs the only shelter in Sonoma County for battered spouses and their children. After they leave the shelter (the average stay is 8 to 10 weeks), they are followed by the YWCA to help them get back on their feet with housing, jobs, and child care.

The Deacons will be providing the volunteers to retrieve approximately 200 presents from the Secret Santa program, deliver them to the YWCA on Third Street, and then be present at specified times to hand out the presents to the YWCA's clients.

These volunteer slots cover December 13 through 21

to pick up the presents from Secret Santa's Heart Central (on Airport Blvd.) and deliver them to YWCA on Third St., and then staff the Holiday Depot on six days from December 14 through 21.

We will have sign-up sheets available in Bowen Hall after Thanksgiving

so that volunteers can pick a time when they are available.

In the case of staffing the Holiday Depot at YWCA,

we ask that each volunteer sign up for a two-hour period.

Also, sometime prior to December 14, the first day that Holiday Depot at YWCA will be open, we will need a few volunteers to help decorate the space we are using for handing out the presents.

Deacons will also be doing a few other things for Christmas, so stay tuned.

ROSES HEALTH MINISTRY

People have really enjoyed David Chung's Saturday Tai Chi classes. Starting in November we will also be offering Qigong by Josepha Eveleigh at 12 noon in Bowen Hall! It is similar to Tai Chi but considered a "Healing Art" rather than a "Martial Art".

Qigong is a mind body healing art from China that incorporates slow rhythmic movements to bring the body into a state of harmony. Qigong can be practiced standing or seated depending on the health and strength of the student. Here are some specific benefits of a Qigong practice:

- Improves the metabolism, digestion, and elimination. Qigong is great for weight control, youthful appearance, and balanced energy.
- Stimulates the lymph system. Qigong builds a stronger immune system so you become less susceptible to viruses.
- Improves the circulation. Qigong soothes and aids conditions such as arthritis and chronic fatigue.
- Retards the aging process by giving the organs of the body an "inner massage." It restores body systems to healthy functioning.
- Reduces tension, blocks, and stagnant energy by increasing oxygen supply to your tissues.
- Lubricates the joints for pain-free movement and greater flexibility.
- Soothes the nervous system so you feel calm and serene.

A Qigong class lasts an hour and is comprised of a gentle warm up, followed by learning and performing a Qigong form, and then finishing with quiet cool down moves. Donations for the class are welcomed.

Josepha Eveleigh is in her late 60's and has been studying Qigong since her 20's. She is a certified Chi-lel Qigong Instructor, an A.C.E. (American Council on Exercise) Certified Personal Trainer and has been a teacher, public speaker, and retreat leader for many years. She moved to Northern California 10 years ago and has worked for The Airport Health Club in Santa Rosa teaching Qigong and Tai Chi for the last ten years.

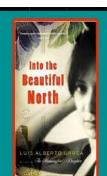
