LEAVE A LEGACY

We ask that you consider being mindful about remembering to include the Presbyterian Church of the Roses in your final estate plans.

Gifts through a Will or a Trust

The most straightforward gift is a specific cash bequest, which can be worded:

"I bequeath to the Presbyterian Church of the Roses, 2500 Patio Court, Santa Rosa, CA, the sum of \$."

If you are worried about naming a specific sum, you can alternatively use a percentage, such as:

"I bequeath to the Presbyterian Church of the Roses, 2500 Patio Court, Santa Rosa, CA, ___% of my residual estate."

This language also works to give the church a specific asset, such as:

"I bequeath my entire holding of Berkshire Hathaway, common stock, to the Presbyterian Church of the Roses, 2500 Patio Court, Santa Rosa, CA."

You will note that in all of these previous examples, there are no restrictions made on the use of the funds by the church. However, with the simple addition of language "... to be used for ___.", you can direct a specific use such as for mission, capital expenses, mortgage pay-down, etc.

Non-Trust/Will Gifts:

Did you know that you can name a residual heir for a bank account? It's called either "Payable on Death" or a "Totten Trust". Your bank account can be titled in your name, with either" payable on death", or "in trust for" Presbyterian Church of the Roses, Santa Rosa, CA. At your death, with presentation of a death certificate to the bank, the funds are remitted directly by the bank to the church. During your lifetime, you still have 100% ownership of the funds.

For more and more of us, our IRA is one of the largest parts of our estate. IRA assets left to an individual are 100% taxable income, which makes them an excellent source for charitable giving because the church pays no income tax. Remember, however, that you cannot designate IRA funds through your Will or Trust. An IRA has its own governing document, and its own beneficiary designation documentation. Specific cash bequests from IRA's don't usually work, but it is perfectly OK to designate a fractional percentage of the IRA to the church. This will not adversely affect an individual named. Contact your IRA Trustee to find out how to make the beneficiary changes. Another asset with a designated beneficiary is a life insurance policy. As with an IRA, you can name the church to

receive all or a percentage of a life insurance policy. Again, contact your insurance company for the necessary beneficiary forms.

For either an IRA or a life insurance policy, the church can be named as a contingent beneficiary. This means that if your primary beneficiary predeceases you, the church can be named as the alternate recipient.

These are just some of the simple ways to remember the church in your final plans. We hope you will consider this an important part of your planning! God be with you!

Finance Update

Operating results are in thru August. Overall, we should be pleased. Pledged

income and non-pledged income is about as close to budget as I have seen in my two years chairing finance. I think the reminder notices we have sent this year, providing our members with an accounting of where they stand with making their pledge has been a big help. If I'm like others, quite honestly I forget as the year unfolds what I pledged so getting a read out showing what I did pledge and where I am relative to hitting my promise is helpful.

A couple of other nice revenue stories.....the Spring Fling was very successful and eclipsed last year handily. Net of expenses it generated over \$3,600; revenue from renting our facilities brought in \$3,259 which is over \$1,300 more than last year thru August.

We continue to manage expenses quite well and our bottom line is about what we expected.

Our annual Stewardship Campaign is

about to commence. The committee will no

doubt come up with some clever ways to illuminate and encourage the importance of giving to our church. We have been very generous from the beginning (65 years ago) and there is no reason to think we won't continue to be generous especially when important needs arise. But here's the bottom line and the essence of stewardship for our church.....we need to hit a minimum of \$368,000 in total revenue as we continue to manage expenses. If we can collect \$368,000 in revenue and hold expenses, we will at least generate enough surplus cash to make all mortgage payments (BTW: current balance on mortgage is \$125,000) without having to dip into our operating reserves. Ideally, we can exceed

\$368,000 and bring in even more to begin building

major capital items that we all know will ultimately wear out and need replacement, e.g. roof, furnace, kitchen equipment, carpets, etc. Without a "capital

"capital reserves" which would be held for those


reserve" whenever something needs replacing, we will need to have a special capital campaign.


Now \$368,000 is about \$23,000 more than we are currently budgeting for total revenue for our church. Now if every member (many already do, but not all) could reimburse the church for the per capita or "tax" we must pay up to the Synod (which is \$37/member), that would bring in an additional \$4,000. We will continue to try and develop more revenue from facility use fees and such, but the generosity from our members is where the biggest difference can come from.

The math works out to be 8%!!!! If all givers (pledgers and non-pledgers) can give 8% more in 2018, our church's financial health will improve nicely. What's 8%?? As an example, for a current \$500 annual giver it's an additional \$40 a year or \$3.34 a month; for a current \$1,000 annual giver, it means \$80 more in giving or \$6.67 more per month; and for a \$2,000 current giver it's \$160 more annually or \$13.34 more per month....and so on.

I pray it can be......


REQUEST FOR COMMUNION SERVERS




