



Christmas is the season of giving. Each year the Deacons organize the Christmas Food Basket and Giving Tree programs to help needy people in our community.

This year 70 families will receive a large basket of food along with gifts for their children. Food will be purchased with funds from the Deacons' treasury that you have so generously donated to throughout the year. During the month of December, the Deacons will make arrangements for picking up the food, packing the baskets and

delivering them and the gifts to each family.

The Deacons need your help! There are many ways you can participate in this important program:

- Church members may volunteer to purchase gifts for children by taking ornaments from the Giving Tree in Bowen Hall on Sunday, November 23rd, Sunday, November 30th, and Sunday, December 7th.
- Names, sex and ages are on each ornament so that appropriate gifts may be purchased.

"GriefShare: Surviving the Holidays" is a helpful, encouraging seminar for people who are facing the holidays after a significant loss, such as the death of a loved one. The seminar will be held in the Rose Room on Sunday, November 16th, from noon to 1:30 p.m. and again on Wednesday, November 19th, from 6:30 to 8:00 p.m. There is no charge for this event and childcare will be provided.

The seminar features practical suggestions and reassurance through video interviews with counselors, grief experts, and other people who have experienced a loss for which they have not yet recovered. Topics to be discussed include "Why the Holidays are Tough," "What to Expect," "How to Prepare," "How to Manage Relationships and Holiday Socials," and "Using the Holidays to Help you Heal."

"Commemorating 40 years as an Eagle Scout in 2014"

George Coffland, Larry Lucas and myself all became Eagle Scouts at the same Eagle Scout Court of Honor in March 1974 at Placer Hills Elementary School in Meadow Vista, CA. (In all my years of scouting I have been to only one other Eagle Scout Court of Honor when three scouts got their Eagle Award. This was with Troop 151 in Coos Bay, Oregon.) To celebrate my 40 year anniversary:

- On May 4: I performed a piano recital for my Dad, Fay and the members of Church of the Roses.
- From Aug 10-12: Brian Smith and I went to visit and tour Colfax, Meadow Vista and Auburn, CA. With a special stop August II to visit Troop 6 at Faith Lutheran Church in Meadow Vista.

 During this trip I saw lots of changes in the area:
- The original staircase at the front of Faith Lutheran Church I had replaced for my Eagle Scout Service Project. This area of the church has since been remodeled, the staircase removed and the old entrance converted into a storage area.
- My family used to live on Meadow Vista Road and Pine Cone Lane. When I lived there this property didn't have a fence around it now it does. Combie Lake is now mostly private property with no public access; forty years ago it was open to the public.

As an Eagle Scout I have helped hundreds of Boy Scouts become better adult citizens. I hope to keep that going for a few more years. I really enjoyed the time we spent during this visit. I won't forget this visit for a long time.
