INVITATION TO THE TABLE

PRAYER OF GREAT THANKSGIVING

The peace of the Lord be with you. **And also with you.**

Lift up your hearts. **We lift them up to the Lord.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **It is right to give God thanks and praise.**

Loving God, in many and various ways you have visited and redeemed your people - finally sending to us your Son, Jesus. We thank you Lord God for sending him to us: As one of us he came, at first a tender infant, then a child, a youth, and an adult. He rejoiced with those who rejoiced, he wept with those who wept. To the despairing he spoke a word of hope, to the sick he gave healing, to the rejected he was a friend. And yet he was betrayed and nailed to a cross. But you, O God, lifted him from the grave and restored him to life that he might be with us and we with him - alive - for evermore.

Therefore with all the saints and with the angels in heaven we praise you, saying:

Holy, holy, holy, Lord, God of power and might, Heaven and earth are full of your glory, Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord, Hosanna in the highest.

Let us proclaim the mystery of our faith:

Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

Loving God, we ask that you send the Holy Spirit upon us and upon these gifts that we are about to receive. May this bread be for us the body and this cup the blessing from Christ Jesus our Lord. Give us the mind of Christ as we partake of this sacrament of life and hope that we may follow him faithfully as we await his return in glory. We ask these things in the name of Christ who taught us to pray saying:

WORDS OF INSTITUTION

DISTRIBUTION OF THE ELEMENTS (please hold the bread until all are served so we may eat together as a church family. Gluten-free wafers are in each plate. You may drink the cup as it is passed symbolizing your individual relationship with God. Both juice and wine are offered. The wine is red.)
