CALL TO RESTORE THE CREATION: A Litany of Calling

*(adapted from a statement written for 202nd General Assembly 1990)* <u>One:</u> Almighty God, Your Creation cries out in this time of ecological crisis. Abuse of nature and injustice to people place the future in grave jeopardy. <u>All:</u> **Biological systems suffer diminished capacity to renew.** <u>One:</u> Earth is abused for reasons of greed and short-term gain. <u>All:</u> **The rich-poor gap grows wider.**  <u>One</u>: Wastes and poisons exceed nature's capacity to absorb them.

<u>*All:*</u> One million species are on the path to extinction. (UN report)

<u>One</u>: Greenhouse gases increase global warming. Therefore, God calls the Presbyterian Church to respond to the cry of creation, human and nonhuman.

# <u>*All:*</u> to draw upon all the resources of biblical faith and the Reformed tradition for empowerment and guidance in restoring creation.

<u>One</u>: The church has a powerful reason for engagement in restoring God's creation:

# <u>*All:*</u> God's works in creation are too wonderful, too ancient, too beautiful, too good to be destroyed.

<u>One</u>: Restoring creation is God's own work in our time. God empowers us to devote our energy towards restoration.

# <u>*All:*</u> The Creator-Redeemer calls faithful people to become engaged with God in keeping and healing all creation.

<u>One</u>: Human life and well-being depend upon the flourishing of other life and the integrity of the life-supporting processes that God has ordained.

# <u>*All:*</u> The love of neighbor, particularly "the least" of Christ's brothers and sisters, requires action to stop the poisoning, the erosion, the wastefulness that are causing suffering, war, starvation, and death.

One: The future of our children and their children and the future for all who come after us is in peril.

# <u>*All:*</u> In this critical time, God is calling us ALL to earth-keeping, to justice, and to community.

<u>One</u>: Holy Creator, please forgive us and help us answer your call! **Amen** (The Lord's Prayer) Amen.
