How the Holy Spirit Works!

On Pentecost I asked the congregation to share with me (and one another) how the Holy Spirit has worked in their lives. A few people shared their stories of faith. I trust you will agree with me that the following accounts of the Holy Spirit's power are inspirational blessings for our mutual faith journey. Thank you to all who were brave enough to share! (Some have been shortened and edited to fit into this newsletter.)



Anonymous Office Manager shared: "A combination of factors had led me to start skipping church and to stop praying. I was upset with my pastor and stubbornly angry with God for leading me into a job that left me jaded and traumatized. My loved ones felt that the job was good for me since it had forced me to create boundaries and stripped me of my naivete. But I could not feel grateful for a flinching heart.

Half a year was spent trying to heal without asking for God's help. I was too afraid of being hurt again to even look for work. One Sunday afternoon, I was out in our overgrown yard admiring the mess of old roses and guessing at pruning. For the first time in six months, I released a prayer. "God, I would like to find a part-time job, close to home, with kind people." The sun was unseasonably warm and the roses were fragrant and glorious. Around 2:30 pm, I heard a voice in my head say, "Go inside and look for a job on Craigslist." I pulled my gardening gloves off and left my hat on to log into my computer. A job listing quickly came up that seemed to fit some of my criteria....but a church? I applied and returned to my roses. The rest is a 5 year history.

I truly believe that the Holy Spirit led me here to heal and return to prayer and church...and ultimately to my current spiritual path. Thank you for being here Church of the Roses! Sometimes it takes a village to heal a heart. Thank you for being my village.



Debbie Shortt shared: "Jesus continuously says to me, "I am your Healer, and I am your Great Physician". I regularly deal with 6 - 8 different areas in my body, where I have intense physical pain, every day, but I live by the power and strength of the Holy Spirit. I've already been living this way for more than 10 years. I am a living, walking miracle, because of who Jesus is to me, and with me and Him, together, we are unstoppable. Jesus is my True Love, my Heart Song, my Sweet Music, my Joy and Contentment, my Precious Treasure, the Anchor of my Soul, and my Everything. I live in Jesus' joy and contentment, despite whatever pain is in my body, or what it looks like, or feels like, because, Jesus, the Living Water, lives in me !!!"



Betsey Yeager shared: In the early '60's, after worshipping at First Pres in San Anselmo, our family switched to Redwoods Presbyterian Church in Larkspur, where the Rev. Frank Hamilton preached. After the death of our 15-year-old son, Bart in 1964, Frank guided us through our grief, eventually recommending that we serve the Presbyterian Church as missionaries. From 1969 until our retirement in the early '90s we served in Colombia, Mexico, Chile, Nicaragua, visiting many other Latin American countries and, later, working for the PCUSA at their headquarters in New York. Upon returning to California, we found Frank Hamilton again at PCOR and worshipped here for about a decade.

My experiences in Latin America exposed me to a different style of worship in Faith Based Communities. After my husband, Ray's death in 2003, I felt called to worship at Knox. Sue Fleenor, with whom we had become familiar when she was at SFTS, created an environment at Knox that was more akin to the communities with which I had become familiar. The worship services there filled me with the Holy Spirit and inspired me to grow more in my faith.

Upon Sue's retirement, I began feeling differently at Knox. Soon, I realized that the Holy Spirit was

telling me to “go back home” to PCOR. Now here, I once again feel moved each Sunday. The music and sermons all fill me with the Holy Spirit and I get to see folks who I have known for so many years!



Tony Burille shared: How to begin my tale. I had been an avid pipe smoker for more than a quarter century, a professional vocalist and musician. Later in 1996 I began to have vocal problems which I thought were due to allergies. Events brought me to the care of an ENT surgeon who diagnosed early damage to my larynx. He warned me about the dangers of smoking and of probable cancer. I was diagnosed with laryngeal cancer in November 2000. Following treatment (chemo and radiation) there was a period of remission until November of 2004. Then, it was removal of my larynx or death within a year. It may be difficult for others to understand but I nearly

decided on death. I had defined my very existence by my musical talents and this belief was my personal identity, my true self. Only the love and devotion of my wife, Linda, persuaded me to have the operation.

Following the operation, convalescence and continued life, I became increasingly bitter internally for having thrown away a God-given gift that was so precious. I began subconsciously to hate myself to the point that even listening to musical performance was more than I could bear. I gave up music, the church, and my love of performing in anger at the “Me” that had survived.

It happened that 11 years later I went to a reception at PCOR in honor of the Reverend Wayne Johnson who had been pastor there. On the way out, Marge Donaldson spotted me and expressed her happiness with seeing me there. I decided to come to a service because of the warmth that I could sense infusing the ethos of this Ekklesia.

During the service that Sunday, something happened that I cannot explain in rational terms except to feel that I was touched by the hand of the Creator. At one point, without preamble, my internal knot of self-hatred congealed in the center of my body and physically, viscerally, fell away from me and I was washed clean of recrimination. I was in a state of what the Bible refers to as a “State of Grace”. I met Pastor Cindy (for the first time) and communicated my state of mind and soul following the service.

I have received many blessings since that time but I still remember that state of grace and endeavor to retain the joy of that moment. I give thanks every day for the people whose lives I touch and for the richness of their gifts to me in brotherhood of the community of Christ. Blessings, Tony



Felipa Jones shared: The Holy Spirit’s loving and guiding breeze was strongly felt during the last week of our beloved Melissa’s life. Although she was not a particularly religious person, not did she have any attachments to any church, 5 days before she died, on a Sunday morning, she answered the call of the deep nudging of the Spirit. She woke up earlier than usual, and said, “Mom, we must go to church today.” We didn’t know where to go, so picked up randomly 3 churches nearby to visit, one of them being our church. By the time we arrived

at church, the worship was over, and people were at Bowen Hall. We asked to speak with the pastor, and Pastor Cindy met us at the annex, after Melissa and I spent time alone in the sanctuary, a very intimate and inspiring time shared between us, when we felt the Spirit speaking to us through the colors of the glass painted windows.

After speaking with Pastor Cindy, as we were leaving, Melissa turned to me and said, “Mom, this is my spiritual home; this is where I want us to come.” I felt shivers going through my body, as I felt the presence of the Holy Spirit so strongly between us. Melissa died 5 days later, and she brought Scott and I to this church. This was her gift for us, her enduring gift of love and gratitude. And every time we now come to church, we feel Melissa’s presence joined with the Holy Spirit, guiding us, nudging us, inspiring us, and giving us hope.

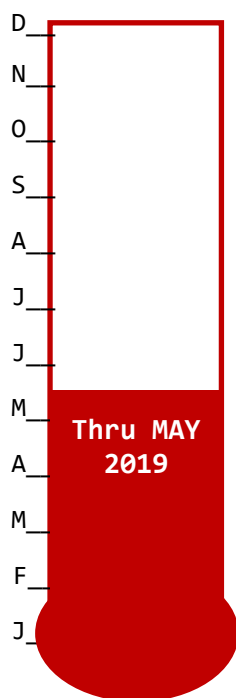
FINANCE

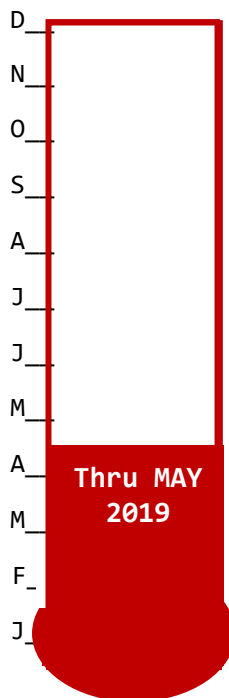

Pat Kerrigan is a third-generation
San Franciscan, who came to
Sonoma County with her eye
(and ear) on radio. In 1980, she
began her broadcasting career at
a top-40 station: 92.9. In 1983,
she became co-host of KZST's
morning show and added promo-
tions director to her resume

which evolved into an enormous commitment to pub-
lic service and serving dozens of non-profit organiza-
tions. In 2001, Pat heard a local doctor speak about
the need for a non-profit breast care center for wom-
en, and went to work. She procured the talents of Lily
Tomlin (who performed for free), and raised a quarter-
million dollars in one night: seed money for the Sutter
Breast Care Center. When the wildfires hit the North
Bay in October, Pat was in the studio by midnight and
spent the next 24 days on the air. She was the voice
of Sonoma County when most other modes of com-
munication were unavailable. Pat provided accurate
information, comfort and compassion to the hundreds
of thousands who ached to know what was going on.

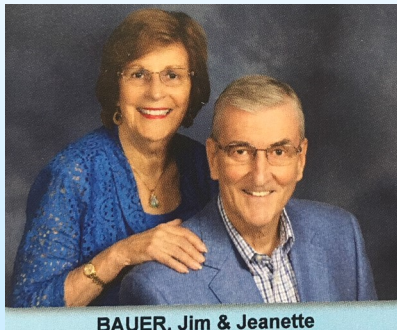

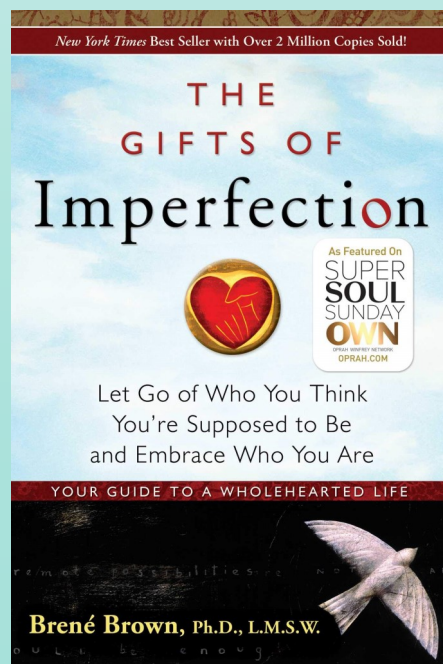

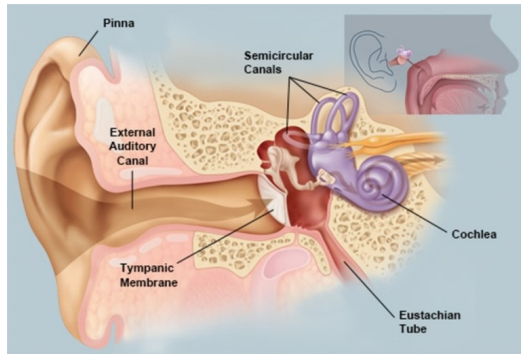

HEALTH MINISTRY: Announces Forum & Support Group For Hearing Loss



***Everyone is invited to a
Forum on Hearing Loss
Sunday, August 25th at 11:30 am
in the Rose Room. Lunch will be provided.
Bring your friends and family!***

Speakers from the Hearing Loss Association of America (HLAA) will be discussing information on Tips for Communicating in the World of Hearing Loss, answering your questions about hearing loss and **introducing a new Hearing Loss Support Group that will be starting at our church.** This promises to be an information-filled event to improve your ability to hear and be heard!!

Communication Tips between Hearing People and People with Hearing Loss (Hearing Loss Assoc.of America (HLAA))

When hearing people communicate with people who have a hearing loss, and when audio is poor, it's important to emphasize the visual, and practice special speaking skills.

Set the stage: Get the listener's attention first. Face her/him directly. Make sure there is adequate lighting in your face. Avoid noisy backgrounds. Ask how to best facilitate communication.

Project your communication: Do not shout. Speak and enunciate clearly. Speak at a moderate pace. Do not cover your mouth, chew food or gum, or smoke while talking. Don't speak from another room.

Rephrase if you are not understood. Use facial expressions and gestures. Give clues when changing subject.

Be empathetic with person with hearing loss: Be patient if the response seems slow or inappropriate. Clarify communication. Stay positive and relaxed. Talk to the person, not about her/him. Show respect to help build confidence.

When people with hearing loss communicate with hearing people, they must acknowledge that communication is a two-way street, and that both parties - those with and without hearing loss - must make as much effort.

Set the stage: Tell others how best to talk to you. Pick your best spot - in terms of light, sound, proximity. Anticipate difficult situations, and plan how to minimize them.

Project your communication: Pay attention. Concentrate on speaker. Look for visual clues. Ask for written clues if necessary. Don't interrupt speaker. Let conversation flow a little to gain more meaning.

Be empathetic with speaking hearing person: React. Let speaker know how well she/he is doing. Don't bluff. Admit it when you don't understand. If unable to concentrate, ask to discuss later.

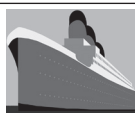

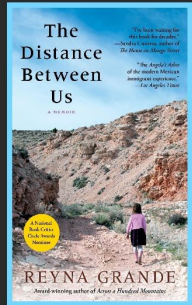
