October is the month of my birth! I don't religiously follow astrological signs, except I know I'm a Scorpio. As a teen it seemed like fun to compare personality traits with my friends claiming to behave the same way as their signs predicted for people born in those months of the year.

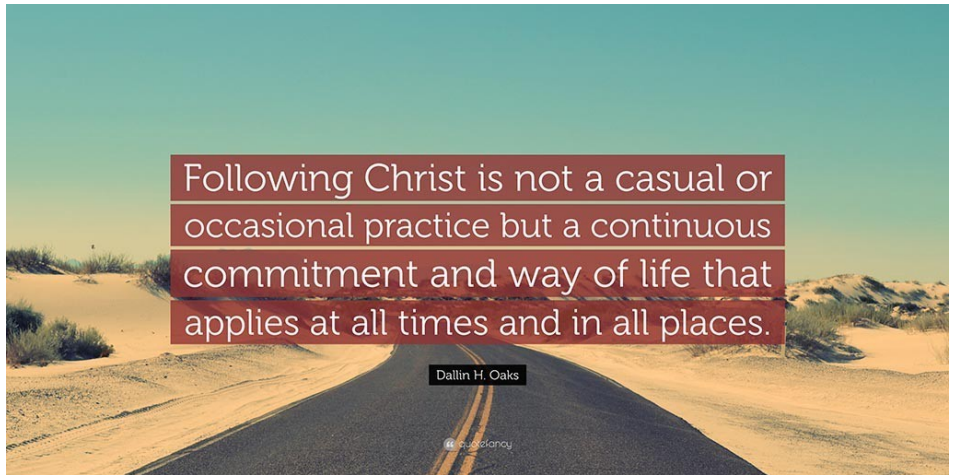
For example, my Zodiac sign traits are described like this: "because of its incredible passion and power, **Scorpio** is often mistaken for a fire sign. In fact, **Scorpio** is a water sign that derives its strength from the psychic, emotional realm. Like its fellow water signs, Cancer and Pisces, **Scorpio** is extremely clairvoyant and intuitive."

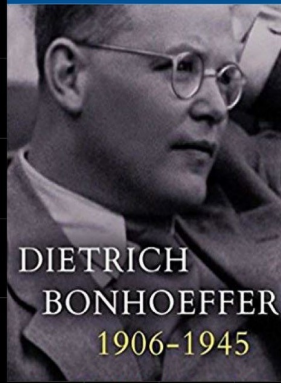

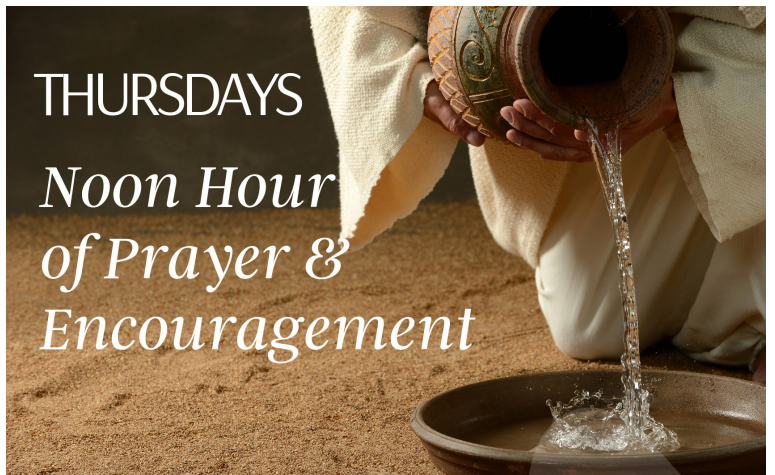

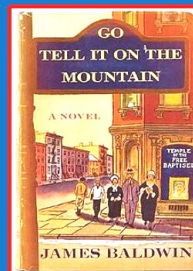

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

This fall we are examining what Hatred in America is and what one man did to combat hatred in Hitler's Germany. His name is **Dietrich Bonhoeffer** and he was a theologian, a Lutheran minister and a soldier for Christ. Utterly fearless, he fought Hitler through words and deeds and refused to leave his nation in the grip of a madman and an anti-Christian ideology. That struggle ultimately cost him his life. The format examines his deeds and words through videos and printed hand outs with discussions following the videos. These classes have started and end on Oct. 21 & Oct. 23. Join us!

The second half of the fall presentation will examine hatred in America through the oral histories of immigrants who arrived on our shores fleeing violence, persecution and hatred in their own mother countries only to find hatred in America. Their stories of perseverance and belief in the goodness of the core values of most Americans and in the moral strength underlying those values is inspiring.

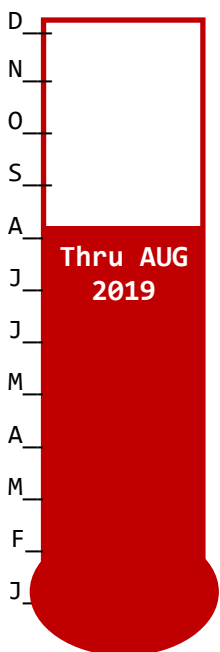
FINANCE

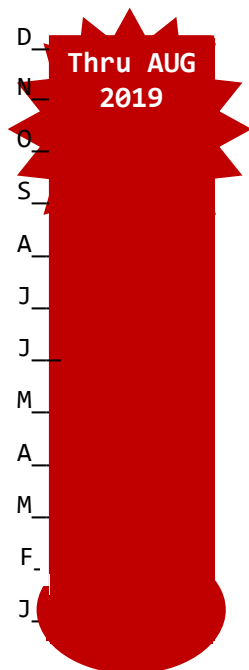

THE FLU VACCINE

Influenza is a contagious infection in the lungs and breathing passages caused by an influenza virus. There are different strains of the flu virus every year. The flu usually has a sudden onset. Symptoms can last 10 days and include can a cough, runny or stuffy nose, sore throat, headache, fever, chills, tiredness, and aches and pain. Caution: **FEVER** can mean 98 or 99 degrees in older people. It can make you very ill, but usually it doesn't lead to further complications. The flu spreads around the US every winter, usually between October and May. It is spread mainly by coughing, sneezing, and close contact.

Complications of the flu include pneumonia and blood and systemic infections (bacteremia and septicemia), or diarrhea and seizures in children. If you have a chronic medical condition (e.g., heart or lung disease), the flu can make it worse.

Preventing the flu: Get your yearly flu vaccine as soon as it's available, usually September. This helps you from getting the flu, making the flu less severe if you do get it, and keep you from spreading the flu to your family and others.

Handwashing is one of the best preventive measures getting any contagious illness! The flu vaccine is given intramuscularly, intradermally (not as deep), and as a nasal spray.

WHO SHOULD GET THE FLU VACCINE:

- Anyone 50 years of age or older
- People who live in a long-term care center, e.g., skilled nursing facility
- All children 6 months through age 18
- Adults and children 6 months and older with long-term heart or lungs problems, e.g., asthma
- Adults and children 6 months or older who needed medical care or were hospitalized during the past year because of diabetes, chronic kidney disease, or a weak immune system (including HIV or AIDS)
- Women who will be pregnant during the flu season
- People who have any condition that can make it hard to breathe or swallow, e.g., brain injury, muscle disorders

- People who can give the flu to others who are at high risk for flu complications. This includes all health care workers and close contacts of people age 65 or older.

CONTRAINDICATIONS TO THE FLU VACCINE include:

- People with a severe allergy to eggs or any part of the vaccine
- People who have had a severe reaction to a flu vaccine in the past
- Anyone who has had Guillain-Barre syndrome (GBS)
- Anybody who is sick with a fever. Get the vaccine once the fever is gone.

Types of flu vaccine include:

Live, attenuated influenza vaccine (LAIV) - Commonly given to healthy, non-pregnant people ages 2 through 49 years of age. It does not contain thimerosal or other preservatives. It is made from weakened flu virus and does NOT cause the flu. Besides the contraindications listed above, others include: people with any long-term heart, lung, kidney, liver, or nervous system; people with heart or breathing problems, or a child who has had wheezing episodes; any pregnant person; a child or teenager who is on aspirin or aspirin-containing products; anyone with a weakened immune system; anyone who will be visiting or taking care of someone within the next 7 days who requires a protected environment (eg., after a bone marrow transplant). It is best to delay this vaccine if you are not feeling well; if you have gotten any other vaccines in the past 4 weeks; if you have taken flu antiviral medication in the past 48 hours, or if you have a very stuffy nose. Possible side effects, especially in younger people, include runny or stuffy nose, cough, fever, headache and muscle aches, wheezing, abdominal pain, vomiting or diarrhea.

Inactivated or recombinant flu vaccine - It has inert or killed flu virus, so is less apt to cause side effects and complications, therefore has less contraindications. You cannot get the flu from this vaccine.

Nasal spray vaccine - It contains weakened flu viruses, and can cause symptoms like a cold. Flu vaccine without egg - Available for those who have a severe egg allergy.

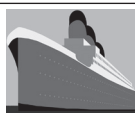
