## AN EASTER MESSAGE FROM PASTOR CINDY

Dear Congregation,

#### FINANCE UPDATE

Well 2018 has started nicely from the finance perspective. After our first month of the new year we are ahead of budget, as well as same period from prior year, in revenue and we are below expenses (budgeted and prior year). That combination made for a nice surplus/profit. Let's hope this is the beginning of a trend!!

#### Preview of coming attractions:

For those who didn't know, we submitted a claim to our insurance company for damages incurred while we were an evacuation center during the wildfires. With 30+ people living in our church as well as a number of pets, we had some accidents as a result that stained the carpets.

In any event, Brotherhood Mutual, knowing damages were on old/worn carpeting awarded us a \$24,000+ settlement. We also had previously asked the Korean congregation for some contribution to us for "wear and tear" and they have provided \$1,500. So we have roughly \$25,000 to use on sorely needed upgrades to our carpets throughout the church, excluding the sanctuary. Building and Grounds has been working on a


"revitalization project" and now seeded with the aforementioned \$25,000 we can start making badly needed improvements and not use operating reserves. The list includes carpeting throughout (excluding the sanctuary), interior painting for Campbell Court and all of the hallways, plus Bowen Hall. And, (drum roll) long overdue "refreshening" of the bathrooms off Campbell Court. This will include new fixtures, removal of the partitions, resurfacing the tile, comfort height toilets, drop ceiling, brighter lighting and fresh brighter paint. Both bathrooms will become "unisex" and will have a lock for privacy. And (bigger, longer drum roll) hot water!!!

Building and grounds is fine tuning the total project cost but for now I'm guessing \$46,000. With \$25,000 from the insurance settlement and the Korean congregation we only need about \$21,000 more and we'll have a "revitalized" church facility. Having such a great start in funding this project, finance will be arranging for a capital campaign (estimated goal \$21,000) to raise the difference so the total project can be done. We already have a \$4,000 commitment from a member so we're off to a great start! Beyond the great feeling of having a well preserved and maintained church property, I would expect a revitalized facility would be an attractive option for weddings and other outside events which will generate increased facility use fees to the church.

So, please stay tuned for more details concerning the capital campaign and if anyone else would like to precommit an amount please let me know because as we launch the campaign to report that we have so much already committed makes the likelihood of a successful campaign more assured.

## ESSENCE OF THE ROSE HEALTH MINISTRY

#### YOUR HEALTH: A SACRED MATTER

Roses Health Ministry hosted a viewing of the film "Your Health: A Sacred Matter" on Sunday February 25<sup>th</sup>, 2018. This film is a documentary chronicling the ways faith and health intersect. Did you know that those folks who attend Church services actually live 8 years longer on average than those who don't have a religious affiliation?

Science has shown the benefits of one's faith along with mind – body practices such as prayer, meditation, music, gratitude and connection to others on overall health. The first hospitals were founded by religious organizations in an attempt to "take care of one's own". With the growth of science, and the belief that science could cure all, practitioners often forgot to minister to the spirit as part of whole person health creating a separation between medicine and religion. This film explores the history of medicine, how various cultures and religions view health and well-being as well as the meanings behind illness, wellness and hope. It demonstrates once and for all, the need for connection of mind, body and spirit in supporting whole person health.

At the intersection of medicine and spirituality in healthcare: Consider these questions and how your view of illness, wellness and healthcare is shaped by your beliefs.

- How does the historic development of our health care system demonstrate that at one time we understood the interconnection of our faith and our health?
- What were the cultural and developmental influences that led to the separation of faith and health; and to the belief that "science is science" and "religion is religion"?
- Do you see evidence that medicine is coming back around to acknowledging a faith and health connection today? Do you see evidence of this in your own medical provider?
- What are the benefits of this belief? Are there down-sides to this belief?
- Where do you recognize the interconnection of mind, body and spirit in your life and health?
- What are mind, body, spiritual practices we can engage in to promote whole person health?
- What are some spiritual practices used by other religions to promote balance and whole person

health? Do these seem "primitive" or enlightened to you?

- In what ways do we "honor God with our bodies"?
- In giving care to another, what has been your greatest challenge? What has been your greatest blessing? Do you agree that care-giving is spiritual work?
- Can a person live with chronic disease or life threatening illness and still be well?

We are considering holding a second viewing of this film later this Spring. Please feel free to discuss these and any health or wellness related questions with our Health Ministry Team to let us know of your interest.




