# COPING WITH THE CHANGES OF LIFE

By the time I write this newsletter, 2021 will be just 6 weeks away! Coping with this pandemic and the realization that the world is permanently changed for all of us and for the church is scary. We want things to be back to normal. We want to go back in time. But we



can't. There is much to learn from this last year and there are many learnings to use in our lives to make them better for 2021. Here are some reminders of passages to focus on as you adapt to the changes that have occurred in your personal and global lives:

■ GOD DOESN'T CHANGE: I am the LORD, and I do not change. And so you, the descendants of Jacob, are not yet completely lost. (Malachi 3:6)

Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever. (Hebrews 13:8)

■ GOD IS WITH YOU: Keep your lives free from the love of money, and be satisfied with what you have. For God has said, 'I will never leave you; I will never abandon you. (Hebrews 13:5)

The LORD himself will lead you and be with you. He will not fail you or abandon you, so do not lose courage or be afraid. (Deuteronomy 31:8)

Remember that I have commanded you to be determined and confident! Do not be afraid or discouraged, for I, the LORD your God, am with you wherever you go. (Joshua 1:9)

■ GOD WILL GUIDE AND HELP YOU: I will teach you the way you should go; I will instruct you and advise you. (Psalm 32:8)

Your word is a lamp to guide me and a light for my path. (Psalm 119:105)

Trust in the Lord with all your heart. Never rely on what you think you know. Remember the Lord in everything you do, and he will show you the right way. (Proverbs 3:5-6)

The famous Mayo Clinic in Minnesota promotes "Building your spiritual life during changes brought about by the COVID-19 Pandemic." Their article suggests: "Change is one constant in our lives, but that doesn't make it easy. The late singer Kenny Rogers used to sing a song with lyrics that said: "Life was so much easier 20 years ago."

Now society is in the midst of monumental change. How will we respond? Here is their advice on how to build your spiritual life during this time of change:

**JUST DO IT.** Nike has the slogan "Just Do It," and this is good advice during this crisis. The first thing to do is to do something. During this COVID response, "Don't waste a crisis." That is, find something to do.

As we are called to be idle at home, it is important that we use this time to think about our lives and how we might do things differently. An idle mind mentality could lead to occurrences of being anxious and

depressed. Doing something can heighten your spiritual energy if you view it as worthwhile. Concentrate on where the divine longs for you to serve, and that will be the most effective work you can do. Strive to live out a fulfilled spiritual life. Maybe you are called to write letters to prisoners. Maybe you want to volunteer at the Empire Food Bank?

COVID-19 is causing many of us to think about how we are spending our time. Previously, much of our lives had been consumed by multiple activities. What if social distancing becomes the new normal? So scheduling time for spiritual lifebuilding can become part of the change and at the same time fill the void of loneliness. Concentrate on tasks and items that bring fulfillment, and increase joy and peace — particularly those that grow your spiritual life.

View the COVID-19 pandemic as an opportunity, rather than just a challenge. Go back to the adage of "Don't waste a good crisis." Herein is the glass half-full versus glass half-empty of changing one's perspective. Another adage goes "A person's perception is his/her reality." Sometimes change can be tilted toward a silver lining and that things aren't as bad as they seem to be.

One way to be prepared for the best- or worst-case scenarios is to see the opportunities amid the challenges. A story was once told of a famous inventor whose laboratory blew up. When asked about the bad in the situation, he replied, "Good, all my mistakes have been erased."

If COVID-19 is seen as an opportunity, then look for the opportunities that may come to you. Look for the good that you can do to help others. Think about small acts you can do to brighten someone else's day. Every drop of water makes an ocean when added together.

WATCH FOR WAYS TO GROW AND LEARN: During this time, try to learn how to Zoom so you

#### **CONSIDER HOW YOU USE YOUR TIME ALONE:**

Now is the time to stay focused on the spiritual disciplines in your life such as prayer and meditation. These disciplines are proven to provide peace for your soul. Prayer is a way to connect to Jesus, and this time of distancing one's self from people and events gives you an opportunity to focus more on your spiritual faith that may be the

most important aspect of

vour life.

Love God and love others during this time. Be of good cheer. Christmas is near! 2021 will be better!

# **Truth Tellers**

A voice cries out in the wilderness. Prepare the Way of the Lord! Thus, spoke the prophet Isaiah 800 years before the birth of Christ. He lived in a time of incredible conflict and doubtless was hoping that the coming of the Messiah would occur within his lifetime. We live 2000 years after the coming of Christ and at times our life can seem very disconnected from the those that we read about in the Bible. But we know that the story of Christianity only begins with the Bible and I found myself thinking the other day "Who are our modern day, prophets?"

We tend to think of prophets as all-knowing seers, who through their connection to God could fore-tell events far off into the future thus giving hope to their listeners. Of course, not all prophesies were like that. There are quite a few prophets who told their people to get their acts together or suffer the wrath of God. Those prophets tended to be quite unpopular with their fellow countrymen and tended to get run out of town or worse. They knew that their words were going to be unpopular and what the implications would be, but they were assured by their faith in God and persisted despite the consequences.

I looked up the word prophet and one of the definitions was: one who tells the truth. There is a long list of historical figures from Socrates to Dr. Martin Luther King who have been persecuted and even lost their lives for telling the truth. Yet despite this, their truths continued to live on. So, who are our truth tellers today? Certainly, the doctors and scientists who have advised us on the proper steps to take to mitigate Covid 19 would fall into that category. You would think that such advice would be noncontroversial but many health professionals receive death threats on a daily basis from misguided individuals who equate wearing a mask and social distancing with assaults on their personal freedom. And yet it is those very doctors who will soon be administering the Covid 19 vaccines in the coming months. Health professionals have had a very stressful year. Let us all take a moment to pray for their safety and well-being during this holiday season.







#### **DEADLINE FOR 2020 GIFTS**

The last date to complete many gifts is 2pm, Thursday, Dec. 31, 2020.

\*Gift checks mailed via USPS with postmark and check date on or before Dec. 31, 2020 will be counted for 2020 regardless of when they are received or deposited by PCOR.

\*Gift Checks dated Dec. 31, 2020 and hand delivered to the church office by 2pm Thursday, Dec. 31, 2020 will be counted for 2020 regardless of when they are deposited by the church.

If we have your email address, your 2020 Giving Statement will be emailed by the end of January 2021. Otherwise, it will be mailed. Look for it!

Giving Envelopes for 2021 can be picked up on most Tuesdays throughout January.

However, it is not necessary that you have these envelopes to facilitate your giving. You can continue to mail your offering to the church without envelopes until we can more easily distribute them. Nancy has your information.



# Advent Prayer Sticks Activity

(Note: If you can't leave your home, consider an Advent Prayer Collage from magazines and cards.)

Find a stick large enough that you can lean on like a broom handle or hockey stick, etc. Take some wool or string and wind it around your stick. You could even use some tinsel if you want to make your stick particularly festive. Choose a (hopefully dry) December day, wrap yourself up warmly, and prepare to take a pilgrimage to the closest bit of nature to where you live, whether a local park or a tree lined street. If possible, join with a few others from your household or organise a socially-distanced walk with neighbours or church friends.

As you journey, when you find something natural on the ground that catches your interest and prompts you to pray, pick it up and weave these items onto your prayer stick using the wool/string to attach it. Only collect things that have fallen or are lying on the ground. For example, a leaf might remind you that the leaves of the trees are for the healing of the nations. Pray for God's creation as you walk, giving thanks for the cycle of the seasons and the importance of winter. (You can find out more about journey sticks by searching online.)

After your pilgrimage reflect on your prayer stick with someone else who has done a similar activity, either online or in person if circumstances allow. Allow your prayer stick to feature in your Christmas decorations and serve as a prompt to pray for our amazing natural world, even in the depths of winter hibernation and in these challenging days of climate change. A different kind of prayer stick is used as part of the worship in the Ethiopian Orthodox Church. These prayer sticks come in many ornate and beautiful styles and are known as makomiya. These are typically used to lean on during long services and to help keep the rhythmic beat for singing hymns. 
