


Reaching Out with Nurturing Love to All People

#### **Did You Know?**

The PCUSA guide for services of Healing and Wholeness states:

"The vital element of worship in the service for wholeness is prayer since this is essentially a time of waiting in faith upon God. The enactment of prayers involves the presiding minister of Word and Sacrament together with representatives of the believing community."
