You created for yourself a world filled with diversity blessed by your breath of life. As the rainbow colors of spring begin to bloom, we see the work of your paint brush upon every face and tree reflect the beauty and diversity of your grace We thank you for bringing us into a community of love, hope, and peace. And so, with all your people on earth in every place where two or more are gathered in your name we praise you saying:

<u>All:</u> Holy, holy, holy Lord, god of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.
