Maundy Thursday Service

April 9, 2020 - 5:30 pm

Maundy Thursday gets its name from the Latin word: "mandatum," which means commandment. Maundy Thursday is the time we celebrate Jesus giving people the new commandment that we love one another as he has loved us.

CELEBRATION OF WORSHIP

Throughout the service the bold type is spoken by the congregation

(This service usually begins with hand-washing by the Deacons, in remembrance of the foot-washing Jesus gave to his disciples to model humility and care for others.)

CALL TO WORSHIP

Leader: When it was evening, Jesus took his place with his disciples, and while they were eating, he said, "Truly I tell you, one of you will betray me."

All: "Who? Who will betray you?" They all wondered, "Surely not me. Tell us who, Jesus!!"

Leader: "The one who dips his hand into the dish with me."

All: "But that's all of us. We all share this common meal...."

In the book of John Chapter 13 it reads: "During supper Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into his hands, and that he had come from God and was going to God, got up from the table, took off his outer robe, and tied a towel around himself. Then he poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel that was tied around him."

On this holy night, O Lord, we gather to ask your blessing. Thank you for the provision of this food and for those who have had a hand in its preparation. May it nourish our holy communion with you and one another as we share together at these tables and remember your love for us in Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord of all of creation. Amen.

THE SCRIPTURE from John 13: 2-15,34-35 continues: Robert Cortez

"He came to Simon Peter, who said to him, "Lord, are you going to wash my feet?"

Jesus answered, "You do not know now what I am doing, but later you will understand."

Peter said to him, "You will never wash my feet."

Jesus answered, "Unless I wash you, you have no share with me."

Simon Peter said, "Lord, not my feet only but also my hands and my head!"

Jesus said to him, "One who has bathed does not need to wash, except for the feet, but is entirely clean. And you are clean, though not all of you." For he knew who was

to betray him; for this reason he said, "Not all of you are clean." After he had washed their feet, had put on his robe, and had returned to the table, he said to them, "Do you know what I have done to you? You call me Teacher and Lord—and you are right, for that is what I am. So if I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have set you an example that you also should do as I have done to you. . .

I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

Table Leaders:

(Pass the bread to others saying, "The Body of Christ given for you"

Hold one piece while the next words of institution are spoken.....)

"Jesus took a cup and gave it to his friends, saying, "This cup is the new covenant sealed in my blood for the forgiveness of sins. When you drink of it, do this in remembrance of me."

(Pass the cup for each to dip their bread into it saying: "The Cup of Blessing."

Show how to dip one piece of bread lightly into the juice in chalice, eat and pass it.)
