

WELCOME AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

*CALL TO WORSHIP: Litany for Mother's Day (responsively)

Today, we are giving thanks to God for the gift of mothers and the mother-like nurture that many people show to others in their lives. Isaiah wrote that God is a mother to us, comforting and carrying us in her arms: "As a mother comforts her child, so will I comfort you...." (Isa. 66:13)

Loving Lord, thank you for your tender care.

Isaiah also wrote that God would never forget us.
God knows each of us, like a mother knows her own children:
"Can a mother forget the baby at her breast
and have no compassion on the child she has borne?
Though she may forget, I will not forget you!" (Isa. 49:15)

Loving Lord, thank you for your tender care.

David wrote that in God's presence, he was quiet and at peace, trusting his mother God like a child safe in loving arms: "But I have stilled and quietened my soul; like a weaned child with its mother, like a weaned child is my soul within me." (Ps. 131:2)

Loving Lord, thank you for your tender care.

Jesus spoke of himself as a mother, longing to wrap his arms around us, like a mother hen gathers her chicks under her wings: "O Jerusalem, Jerusalem... how often I have longed to gather your children together, as a hen gathers her chicks under her wings, but you were not willing." (Matt. 23:37)

Loving Lord, thank you for your tender care.

Paul writes about his missionary ministry and likens his work to that of a caring nurse who looks after those in her care: "...but we were gentle among you,

like a mother caring for her little children." (1 Thess. 2:7)

Loving Lord, thank you for your tender care. With joy in our souls we now honor and worship you!

God is here! As we your people meet to offer praise and prayer, may we find in fuller measure what it is in Christ we share. Here, as in the world around us, all our varied skills and arts wait the coming of the Spirit into open minds and hearts.

Grant us peace in our relationships.

We lift up in prayer caregivers around the world who face special challenges during this tragic time of the pandemic; for those caregivers who are caring for orphans; for caregivers who are without food, walking long distances with children in their arms; for caregiver refugees fleeing war-torn countries who are trying desperately to protect their children from bombs, gangs, and guns. So many dangers in this world, Lord, and you know them all.

Bring peace to our troubled times, justice for those who are oppressed, hope to those who feel hopeless.

God, you love us with a parent's love, you care for us more tenderly than any mother. You are the Great Caregiver.

Help us this week to be especially aware of your love, your gaze upon us, encouraging us, sustaining us, directing us to care for one another.

We ask these things as we pray the prayer Jesus taught us to say: (The Lord's prayer)

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name.
Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our debts,
as we forgive our debtors. And lead us not into temptation
but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom and the
power and the glory, forever. Amen.
