ABOUT THE BULLETIN COVER ARTIST: Richard Hook (1914-1975) was a talented and inspired artist who was best known for painting sketches of Jesus in the 1960's and 1970's. He created major religious works for many publishers over the years, including Concordia Publishing House. Titles such as such as the **Head of Christ** and **The Good Shepherd** are often credited to his wife Frances Hook — an artist who would later be called "the Berta Hummel of America" for her ability to capture the emotions and expressions of youngsters in everyday situations.
