Meet our New Choir Director



We are delighted to introduce our new Director of Music Ministry, Carol Menke. She is coming to us from Church of the Incarnation where she has been Director of Music for many years. Carol will start in January of 2022. New year, new beginnings! The Choir Director Search Task Force is thrilled Carol Menke accepted the offer to become our new Choir Director. The Session also unanimously voted to offer the position to Carol who is known in the Santa Rosa region as a musical treasure. She will bring new energy and a wealth of experience that will enhance our worship services and special concerts.

Carol maintains a full schedule as teacher and choral conductor in addition to solo engagements. She teaches voice and music theory classes at Santa Rosa Junior College and is the Artistic Director of Cantiamo Sonoma, a distinguished a cappella chamber choral ensemble, and teaches privately in her vocal studio in Santa Rosa. Carol is also the Artistic Director of the Santa Rosa Children's Choral Academy.

Choral conductor and lyric soprano Carol Menke began her musical studies at the piano with her mother at age five, and at age eight, started flute lessons. She entered college with aspirations of a career as a flautist. However, participation in a voice class led to recognition of her superb vocal gifts. Following graduation from CSU at Chico, she attended the Franz Schubert Institute in Baden bei Wien, Austria, which confirmed her passion for the Art Song genre. The younger singer was heard in performance many times at the Schuberthaus in Vienna. Miss Menke later completed her Master's Degree in Vocal Performance.

THE INFLUENCE OF APOCRYPHA: The term "apocrypha" comes from the Greek and means

"hidden" or "secret." The apocryphal writings of early Christians have a reputation for being heretical because they are not part of the New Testament's 27 canonical books. But as you will learn in this first lecture, these early Christian writings have contributed greatly to Christian culture and doctrine.

JESUS AND MARY IN THE PROTO-GOSPEL OF JAMES: Begin your foray into the early Christian apocrypha with an extended reflection on the Virgin Mary. You may think you know her from the New Testament gospels, but you might be surprised to find out that much of her life's story actually comes from the Proto-Gospel of James, which fills in many of the gaps from the canonical gospels.

YOUNG JESUS IN THE INFANCY GOSPEL OF THOMAS: The Infancy Gospel of Thomas is considered a bizarre book, offering what some see as troubling insight into the childhood of Jesus, portraying him as both amazingly divine but also troublingly human. Delve into some of the scholarly debates around this book and find out why it was so popular in the Middle Ages.

JESUS AND THE MAGI IN THE APOCRYPHA: The New Testament gospels leave many questions on the table: Why was Mary a virgin if she was married to Joseph? How did Joseph feel about his wife bearing the child of the Lord? In this lecture, see how many early Christian apocryphal works humanize Joseph and resolve some of the questions—and contradictions—of the New Testament.

PERSONNEL

The Committee will end the year with two job positions to fill for the new year. First, is to replace the Director of Music with Myles Ellis leaving us in October. We have interviewed a candidate and will be offering a contract with the thought of a hire for the first of 2022.

The second position will be a new hire for Director of Family Ministries. This person will actively work to bring new and young families to PCOR. With input from Christian Ed and Membership, a job description has been approved and we will be moving forward to recruit a person to fill this position in 2022.

We look forward to having these positions filled so that we can expand and energize PCOR to greater heights in 2022.

Thank you to all those on the Committee for their commitment to keep our staff strong throughout the past COVID years.

FINANCE

Well, we're 10 months through 2021 and things are almost back to normal. By the time you read this there will be less than a month remaining. Expense control is the secret to our financial year. Thanks to it, we are nearly at a breakeven for the year with just a very modest negative of \$2500. The biggest impact to our revenue has been unpledged support which I think is related to in-person worship, i.e. go to church, put something in the basket....don't go, don't give. It's notable how that revenue item has grown with the resumption of in person worshiping. The other hit to revenue was the closure of the preschool. The preschool paid the Church \$25,000/yr for various services. Of course, when they closed the Church didn't receive the \$25,000.

On a more positive note, our last PPP Loan (part of the economic stimulus program) has been forgiven so we'll recognize roughly \$80,000 into revenue (approx. \$44,000 for the Church and \$36,000 for the preschool). And, we have submitted the paperwork for an ERC credit (another part of the economic stimulus) that would give us another \$41,000 (\$30,000 Church \$11,000 preschool roughly) in revenue! Thank you U.S. Government!!

As always, never hesitate to ask me anything about our Church finances. And thank you for your continued financial support!


