
The committee is excited to be investigating other mission trip options for this year including the possibility for an international mission trip to Kenya so stay tuned.



FAMILY MINISTRIES & OUTREACH



A Message from the Personnel Committee

Session began working on our 2023 budget in November. Our first 2023 draft budget showed an over \$80,000 deficit in income over expenses. As a result the finance committee asked each committee to reduce their expenses in hopes of closing the budget deficit. The Personnel committee, being the largest expense item in the budget, has to reduce our staff. We are not giving any staff raises in 2023, we are closing the office one day a week to help reduce staff expenses and regrettably, we will be eliminating the Family and Youth Directors position.

The committee is very disappointed to have to do this, but we had very limited options in reducing our personnel budget. Kristi Gray had done such a fine job of reaching out to the youth who come to the MHS breakfast and families that have been coming to worship on Sundays. We regret that we had to eliminate this position. We wish Kristi and her other non-profit work at NuBridges the very best. We hope we can stay connected.

The Deacons had their last meeting of the year at the lovely home of Ellen Bowen where we met in person for the first time this year.

Donations from the Deacon fund in November included \$500 to The Boy's and Girl's Club, \$500 to Social Advocates for Youth, \$500 for the Living Room, and \$500 for the Council on Aging.

These donations span folk of all ages from children to senior citizens.. In December we donated \$2,000 to boost the PCOR Montgomery Breakfast Program. A big thank you to everyone who has donated to the Deacon's fund this year.

We could not make donations without your help. This year the Giving Tree was a success. 22 gifts were filled for the New Bridge program for needy teenagers and 22 gifts for our Senior Citizens in the Council on Aging group. Thank you all for your generosity! We are excited to present a new opportunity for the Congregation to help women in need by asking you to donate good quality used purses



This program will be called "Diva Day Bags." They will be going to Redemption House and other homeless women. You will hear a great deal about this program soon. FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

The Stewardship Campaign for 2023 has come to an end. The budget adopted has assumed pledged income of \$219,000, and total operating income of \$312,450. However, our expenses are expected to total \$347,640, leaving a projected deficit of \$35,190.

To reach these numbers, Session has had to make some difficult decisions to reduce our operating expenses. First of all, there were no raises built into this budget for any staff member, including Pastor Cindy. Secondly, Session voted to close the church office on Mondays, thereby reducing the hours of our Office Administrator. Third, Session voted to eliminate the position of Director of Family Ministry and Outreach. Thus, we regrettably no longer have the services of Kristi Gray.

Together the Finance Committee and Session will continue to examine ways to reduce expenses and increase income. The Fellowship Committee is already planning a Spring Fling Fundraiser which we hope everyone will support. We will also work to find grants to help fund the church programs, such as the Montgomery High School Breakfast Program, or means to reduce office overhead.

The continued financial support of our congregation is more important than ever. If everyone raised the promised support by 10% for the coming year we could significantly reduce the deficit. Together we can keep our church thriving for years to come.
