May You Have a Good Enough Lent!

Psalm 37: 1-7 reads: "Do not fret because of the wicked; do not be envious of wrongdoers for they will soon fade like the grass, and wither like the green herb. Trust in the Lord, and do good; so you will live in the land, and enjoy security. Take delight in the Lord, and God will give you the desires of your heart. Commit your way to the Lord; trust in him, and he will act, God will make your vindication shine like the light, and the justice of your cause like the noonday. Be still before the Lord, and wait patiently; do not fret over those who prosper in their way, over those who carry out evil devices.

"Now imagine that you could choose to do what is truly life-giving, joyful, and meaningful, something that brings you closer to God, if you'd like. You in particular, not anyone else. What might those things be? What memories, thoughts, hopes, or awarenesses are surfacing, about what makes you feel most spiritually alive?"

(The above paragraph is an excerpt from the Lenten devotional we have prepared for you to use during Lent. We have some in print and the pdf is on our website. Dr. Kate Bowler, who wrote it, is a seminary professor at Duke Divinity.)

Since Dr. Bowler is dealing with cancer as a middle-aged mother, I am amazed at her ability to share uplifting and inspiring messages despite all she is going through! She seems has come to an attitude of peace about her diagnosis. And that attitude demonstrates her deep faith in God's love for her.

Our church goes through anxious times and we fret and worry about our finances, our numbers, and our future. But time after time in my 10+ years here I have seen God's faithfulness shine through and disperse the darkness of our anxieties. We came through the pandemic in good shape! We lost very few members

SESSION MEETINGS JANUARY/FEBRUARY 2024

In the Clerk's Reports to Session, it was noted that the cumulative membership of the church through February 2024, counting new members less deaths to date, is a net positive 4 members. Approved art show by Bob Sorani & Dennis Darrow on 4-20 – 4-21-24. Approved a postcard mailing to our neighborhood which will announce Easter week activities. Approved for membership Chris Bowen, Mia Krause, Bob Kothmann, and Tom Kibbe.

- <u>Building & Grounds</u>: Spotlight over the lectern has been replaced. Eagle Scout landscaping project for our SW corner is proceeding.
- <u>Christian Education:</u> Adult Bible Study continues with Lenten study of "The Historical Jesus" thru 3-20-24. Successful Parent's Night Out on 2-9-24 had 31 children attending.
- <u>Church & World</u>: \$2,000 grant for the Montgomery H.S. Breakfast Program from Centsability received. Presentations by Palestinian speaker on Sunday, 1-7-24 and Rabbi Shalom Bochner on 2-45-24 each drew approx. 50 people.
- Fellowship: Church retreat at Westminster Woods is now tentatively 09-13-24 09-145-24.
- Finance: See above action items. January results showed net income of \$4,096.





The **Cents-Ability** collection baskets are in the Narthex and Campbell Court on the second Sunday of every month. The collection is for the Presbytery Hunger Fund. We are able to keep 25 percent of the contributions which will go toward the Montgomery High School Breakfast fund. We also have submitted the Hunger Task Force Cents-Ability Grant Application to request more funds for the MHS Breakfast Program.



We started the new year with presentations on perspectives of the Hamas-Israel war. Our first presentation, on January 7th, was the Palestinian perspective by Rev. Michael Yoshii, Co-Chair of Friends of Wadi Foquin, and Adam Manasra, a 26year-old Palestinian from the village of Wadi Foquin. Friends of Wadi Foquin is a partnership that started in 2009 between United Methodists and the Palestinian Muslim village of Wadi Foquin. They supported community development projects in the village, organized annual Holy Land pilgrimages with visits to



the village and other Palestinian communities. Our second presentation, to balance sides, was on February 4th. The presenter, Rabbi Shalom Bochner, of B'nai Israel Jewish Center in Petaluma, shared the long history of conflicts between Israel and Palestine. He also prays that the Israeli government will find peaceful ways to end this war with Hamas.

The application was submitted February 12th. This year we were able to add the solar panels which were installed and connected to the electrical grid!

Well! The winter rains have slowed things down quite a bit for our crew. Currently we have been working in the Youth Room trying to better prepare it for expansion of the preschool program in coordination with the Korean congregation. As you can see in the picture we recently talked Chris into climbing up to tend to a chancel spotlight. Unfortunately the new bulb did not correct the problem and we are working with the Audio Visual team to repair or replace the control component for that fixture. There is an intermittent roof leak in the kitchen. We think we are zeroing in on but it can't be tended to until we get consistently dry weather. The leak is in the part of the roof that wasn't replaced recently.

We are also working on cleaning, pruning and providing light and power to the patio area off the Rose Room. We are anxious to get outside and address new mulch, lawn care, weed control and repair of a leaky irrigation supply line.






