Why We Should Care for the Children of Kenya By Pastor Cindy

Isaiah 6: 6

The wolf shall live with the lamb, the leopard shall lie down with the kid, the calf and the lion together, and a little child shall lead them.

James 1: 27: Religion that is pure and undefiled before God the Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their affliction, and to keep oneself unstained from the world.

Children are precious in the eyes of God and especially those who need our special care such as the orphans. Three times previously I have worked with the orphanage that was founded by Reverends Stephen & Rosemary Mbogo in 2004. They give wonderful tender loving care to the children in need of shelter, food, and education in the Ngong Hills region of Kenya (south of Nairobi). The children's home



they have established



is a well organized expansive resource where the orphaned and abandoned children can thrive. It has grown from a few children to over 200 and it has become a campus with a chapel, school, farm/garden, and recreation area.

God loves the children of Kenya equally with our own children here in the US. We love them on behalf of God and show them God's love by teaching about Jesus. I will be teaching the kids the song: *Jesus Loves Me* using sign language. Our team of 19 will be helping to build a dormitory in

June. We are taking 100 pairs of glasses that have been donated to help the children with sight problems. We are thankful for any donations and funds you may contribute to the trip which will be used for the biggest need the children are





Net Ordinary Income - 3 month




Regular Giving (does not include special giving) - 3 month


Thanks to all who donated plants and brought flowers to place on the cross in the yard. There are still Sundays in the summer available for anyone wanting to donate flowers for our Sunday worship service. The signup calendar is in Campbell Court. If that is not convenient for you or you forget when at church, you can call the office and someone could check on dates and sign you up. There are two ways to donate flowers. One is to designate a contribution of \$35 or \$50 depending on the size of arrangement and the Worship Committee will see that they are purchased and placed. The second way is to bring the flowers yourself. In either case, they are yours to take after the service. You can let the office know the dedication you would like to make when giving flowers.

We will celebrate Pentecost on June 8, 49 days after Easter. Flames and a dove have been used to represent the Holy Spirit descending on a gathering of apostles on Pentecost. We encourage people to wear bright colors—red, orange and yellow on that day.

The following week, we'll wrap up our school year with our annual End-of-Year Potluck. This




Breath of the Spirit: Caring for Creation and Children at ByGrace


Maundy Thursday Worship & Soup Supper — A Night of Blessing




Each Sunday morning from 7:30-8, we broadcast a 30-minute church sermon on KSRO radio.






