THE SEASON OF HOPE

By Pastor Cindy "We must accept finite disappointment, but never lose infinite hope." (Martin Luther King, Jr.)

I attended a dergy retreat at the Zephyr Point Presbyterian Camp South Lake Tahoe. The theme was on hope. It was perfect timing because our world needs hope and love now more than ever with the wars raging, and the climate change destruction affecting all of us in some way. Yet, Nature is resilient.



The Season of Thanksgiving and Advent/Christmastime are naturally seasons of hope. When we list what we are grateful for we automatically feel hopeful. When we enter into the magic of the Advent and Christmas season, remembering the hope in the Lord that came to be through the birth of a child, we can't help but believe in miracles. I love that quote by Albert Einstein when he said:

"There are only two ways to live your life. One is as though nothing is a miracle. The other is as though everything is a miracle."

Sometimes we might think it is silly to believe in a virgin birth bringing the savior into our world. But no matter how it happened (or if the details of the story are not scientifically verifiable), the Christmas story still has the power to bring us out of a dark cold despair into a light of hope and faith. In the Clerk's Report to Session, the church's cumulative membership for 2023 increased by a net of 12 members, with a total of 19 new members, including 10 affirmed in September.

Pastor Cindy and Associate Pastor Lynn Vandercook will host two grief sessions on 11/18 and 11/25, focusing on "Surviving the Holidays."

<u>Action Items</u>: Approved an expenditure to Santa Rosa Fire Equipment for the repair of a leaking sprinkler head in a Campbell Court restroom, with costs ranging from \$957 to \$1,557.

COMMITTEE HIGHLIGHTS

Building & Grounds: Power washing is complete, and exterior painting is underway, starting at the Spring St. entrance.

<u>Christian Education</u>: Adult Bible study continues through 11/15. An Advent study based on "The Chosen" begins on 12/6, and Christmas Crafts Night is scheduled for 11/29 from 5:30 – 7:30 PM.

<u>Church & World</u>: Serving over 100 burritos daily at the MHS breakfast, seeking additional funding sources. The Pentecost Offering is used for the breakfast. The Doran Beach clean-up was a success, and Alternative Christmas funds will be collected in the first two weeks of December.

Fellowship: Upcoming events include Trunk or Treat on 10/31, Scout Sunday on 11/05, and Stewardship Luncheon on 11/12. Fellowship hour sign-ups are available through 11/19.

<u>Finance</u>: Despite a \$16K deficit, we are ahead of the budgeted deficit of \$27K through September. The Stewardship letter will be mailed this week.

Nominating: Still in need of a new Elder to lead the Worship Committee. Ellen is attending other committee meetings for familiarization.

Personnel: Direct deposit for staff salaries is now in place.

<u>Worship</u>: Liturgist training will be held on 10/15, and three new members have joined the liturgist team. Food collection for REFB will occur on 11/12, 11/19, and 11/26. A Christmas concert is scheduled for 12/17 at 4:00 PM.

The next meeting is on 11/28, with a potluck at Pastor Cindy's home on 12/19.


FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT:

Thru the first 9 months of this year, we are pleased to report that our regular giving is trending close to budget. Thank you for your continued financial support.

The 2023 Annual Budget was approved with a projected deficit of \$35,000 with a goal of breaking even. With the increased income and diligent attention to expenses, PCOR closed the first 9 months with a manageable loss of \$16,134. This is better than the budget projected loss of \$27,131. We are making great strides in having a breakeven year. Thank you for your increased financial support and let's keep it up.

The Montgomery High School breakfast program has decreased expenses and is in need of your heartfelt support. Please consider a special giving to the MHS breakfast program. Again, thank you.

In 2020, the Boy Scouts of America began admitting girls into Scouts BSA, leading the Presbyterian Church of the Roses to create Troop 135G as a companion to its long-standing Boy Troop. Ten girls have joined Troop 135G, officially chartered in April 2023.

Troop 135 is fundraising by offering "Trees and Wreaths for Troops" to support active-duty military families. Your tax-deductible dona-

Dec 25, Monday – Christmas. Joy to the world our Lord is come! We celebrate His birth in our hearts.



months and, we hope, rainy season things are slowing down. The community garden grew like crazy but it was tough getting those tomatoes to ripen. The garden has



been cleared and we will harvest and remove the front lawn sun flowers in coming weeks.

Dennis Darrow has almost finished power washing much of the lower portions of the property. Soon we will begin refreshing the exterior paint in these areas.

Bill Morgan continues to work on the sanctuary heating system and we believe it is ready to go when cold weather calls.

We have figured a work around making the kitchen dishwasher functional while we determine if and how to replace the hot water booster unit.

One pressing issue is an "Oh so slow" leak in the fire sprinkler head in a Campbell Court restroom. While the leak is very minor it has to be fixed. Because it's the fire system it's a fairly complex and, of course, expensive process that must be done by professionals. The Building & Grounds motion to authorize payment of \$2,864.93 to Santa Rosa Fire Equipment, Inc. to conduct the Fire Sprinkler recertification inspection required by state and local agencies every five years was approved.


