#### Give From Your IRA

An IRA is a great way to save for retirement. You can make a contribution and enjoy the tax savings. # AN UPDATE FROM SESSION

# CA AB-506 NEW MANDATED REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

CA AB-506, effective January 1, 2022, includes new requirements for mandated reporting in churches and youth-serving organizations. Each church must now register with the Department of Justice to receive an official number for reporting. After months of waiting, our staff has finally succeeded in obtaining this number.

Each individual church which serves children or youth must provide fingerprints for all staff, Session members, and any volunteer who works with children or youth for 16 hrs. or over in a week, or 32 hrs. per year. This includes Sunday School volunteers, Montgomery High School Breakfast volunteers, Parents Night Out volunteers, Vacation Bible School volunteers, etc. LifeScan brought their mobile finger-print unit to the church on Sunday, October 30, so most of us have this requirement behind us. For any that missed this opportunity, please contact the church office for information as to where you may go to get this done; costs will be covered by the church, but donations to help defer this cost are welcomed.

From the fingerprinting, detailed background checks will be run. Our church will be alerted should there be any who do not meet the

standards for working with children or youth. We are also alerted should there be any subsequent changes in status, so we will always know that we are maintaining safety standards.

hose required to be fingerprinted must also complete the child abuse training soon. If you have completed training with another organization, this will qualify for us; please forward a copy of your certificate to Raven in the church office, who is keeping a file for our church. If you have not already completed training, please do so online at https://mandatedreporterca.com. For anyone who needs computer access, feel free to come to the church and use any of our free computers.

Remember, these mandates are a result of too many churches NOT keeping children safe. It is always best to err on the side of being well trained and sure that everyone has a background check to show how much we care about the safety of the kids we serve.
