Our Guest Preacher today is our new Santa Rosa Police Chief John Cregan. Chief Cregan grew up in southern Louisiana, and moved to Sonoma County when he was 12 years old. His father was a pastor and his mother was a nurse at Memorial Hospital. Chief Cregan and his family have attended Santa Rosa Bible Church for the last 20 years and Chief Cregan leads a Sunday morning life group at the church. He lives in Rincon Valley with his family.

Chief Cregan has been a police officer for over 23 years and has worked a variety of assignments to include motorcycle officer in the traffic division, Gang Detective, Hostage Negotiator, and Field Training Officer. He has a Master's Degree in Law Enforcement and Public Safety Leadership from the University of San Diego. He is committed to providing mental health-first response for persons and families experiencing a mental health crisis. Chief Cregan developed and implemented the city's InResponse Mental Health Support Team, diverting calls from law enforcement to mental health professionals.
