**December - Always popular is our Christmas Caroling and White Elephant Exchange** (caroling host?) Morgan's for party


January - TBA - ideas? February - TBA - ideas?

#### COMMUNITY KIDS HAD A BLAST AT THE PCOR CHILDREN'S FESTIVAL!

The Children's Festival on Saturday, August 6, the second of our 70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebrations, was a rousing success!



35 kids and 17 adults officially signed in at our registration table, but there were at least another 10 kids who came but did not sign in, as well as church members who came with their children/ grandchildren. Then there were the Girl Scouts who ran the Hot Dog Stand, and the host of volunteers who did sign-up, made popcorn, made snocones, made multiple batches of bubble mixture for the giant bubble wands, welcomed visitors, distributed backpacks, and handled the set-up and breakdown. All in all, we estimate that there were at least 62-70 participants, many of whom enthusiastically tumbled through the Jumpy House for hours, or squealed with delight when a giant bubble sailed overhead.

We distributed 55 of our 100 backpacks, and the remaining 45 were donated, via Guy Cottle, to the Luther Burbank Elementary School, where they were welcomed by the staff for distribution to needy students.

Many of those attending provided their email addresses, so these folks have now been added to our weekly distribution list to stay in touch.

Thank you to all who helped make this a great neighborhood event.

# Blue Theology Mission Station PCOR Mission Trip 2022 was a Success!

Your Church and World Committee, aided by Pastor Cindy's coordination with Pastor Daniel Paul at The Blue Theology Mission Station (http://bluetheology.com/about.html) in Pacific Grove California, sponsored a

multi-generational team of 15 volunteers. The Church of The Roses gets credit towards maintaining its certification as an Earth Care congregation for developing this trip.

The team spent the week of August 7<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> learning about the good work of the Christian Church of Pacific Grove. Since 2008 they have educated over 50 youth groups, college and University groups from all over the country about the history of the area and lessons learned from preventable man-made ecological disasters over the years.

The PCOR mission team heard about the exploitative whaling, overfishing of sardines and

abalone and culling of sea otters that has driven so many of God creations to near extinction.



Plastic and microplastic ocean pollution was also studied at the Monterey Bay Aquarium and observed first-hand as the team spent over two hours cleaning up several of the local beaches clearing; litter, plastics, glass, discarded plastic toys, fishing tackle, electronics etc.



The team was in awe of the multiple sightings of mass feeding on sardines by 6 hump-back whales, sea lions and sea birds that worked together to round up and feast on them. Lastly, Pastor Dan's intern Gabrielle Poli, who coguided us, gave a lecture on the good work of the Creation Justice Ministries (<a href="https://www.creationjustice.org">www.creationjustice.org</a>) whose mission statement reads: Creation Justice Ministries educates, equips and mobilizes Christian individuals, congregations, denominations, and communions to protect, restore and rightly share God's creation.

The team also took part in "citizen science" collecting data on sand crabs organized by LIMPETS (Long term monitoring program experiential training for students). https://limpets.org

In addition to participating in daily worship and reflections with Pastor Dan, the team cooked, cleaned and dined together. On day three the team took a kayaking trip to Elkhorn Slough in Moss Landing to observe sea otters with their pups up close. They even tasted seaweed lettuce!


# **ROSEBUD PRESCHOOL**



#### **Gold Rush Story**

told by Ray Alden

In the era of 1849 - 1860, the chance of finding gold in Northern California was good enough to energize a lot of history. In what we now call the Midwest, the Kansas River (known locally as the Kaw) meets the Missouri River at a place well-known then as Westport. This was the gathering site for many men, with and without families, singly and in groups, come to join forces in wagon trains.

For the hazardous trip West, one such wagon train is the focal point of this story.

[The story was told to me by my mother when I was very young. I do not know if it is true. It may, or may not be a part of our family heritage. As far as I know, it is not recorded anywhere else, and this is entirely from memory.]

As was true of most wagon trains, this one contained sub-groups which had leaders of their own. In this train, soon after its departure from Westport, there was a disagreement about its travel

schedule. One group insisted on six days of travel followed by rest on the Sabbath. The majority insisted on traveling every day in the interest of crossing the mountains before winter. The wagon train quickly split into two separate parties.

Across the plains the larger group gradually pulled ahead, and by the time they reached the Rocky Mountains it was far ahead of the smaller group. But then the going became harder.

The smaller group, dependent on horses and other laboring beasts as were all wagon trains, travelled farther on each travel-day than did the larger group, their animals having benefitted from a day's rest. In the mountains, the distance between the two groups began to narrow. By the time they were crossing Nevada, approaching the Sierras, the smaller group had overtaken and passed the larger group. Those who had rested one day each week crossed the summit of the Sierras, somewhere in the vicinity of Lake Tahoe, before the heavy snows fell. As my mother concluded the story, "The Donner Party did not make it."

## World Communion Sunday – October 2


