Advent/Christmas/Epiphany is Almost here! By Pastor Cindy

The Advent devotional I found for us this year is: A Weary World Rejoices by Dr. Kate Bowler of Duke Uni-



versity. She loves to preach, lecture, and write books about life's struggles and joys, hopes dashed, and promises kept. She had stage IV cancer and now she is cancer free and grateful. Her podcast is titled: *Everything Happens*. In the introduction she writes:

"Have you been looking at the jaw-dropping new im- ages that are coming in from the James Webb Space Telescope? These photos of deep space are wild and surreal. Pillars of gas and dust. Clouds of yellows, oranges and blues that capture the mystery and dazzling beauty of the universe. You are immediately struck by the sense that there is so much out there, but it's not here. Not yet.

The days leading up to Christmas (we call this season Advent) are kind of like that. It is a promise that is coming, as surely and steadily as light traveling from a distant star. It is the promise of a return, a restoration of all things to their true being, a goodness which was conceived from the beginning of time, a realized hope we've been longing for. For the "days are coming," say the prophets of old. "The days are coming," declares the Lord, "when I will fulfill the good promise." The promise of truth, compassion, restoration, and justice. These four promises are developed in the devotional guide. They will serve as our guiding themes—pulling us toward a future that we can only glimpse. But it is a future that will turn everything upside-down (or maybe right-side up). Everything wrong will be made right; everything bad will be made good; everything empty and devoid of love will be filled."

I don't know if Dr. Bowler credits prayer or a miracle for her cancer remission. But it is wonderful to learn that such a great inspirational person has a longer life to live. Kate remains alive today because the cancer responded to a new immunotherapy drug. She makes the best of living with the uncertainty of what the future holds. For now, she is cancer free.

I hope you will live Advent differently this year in some way. Maybe take more time to take care of yourself. Maybe share your life with someone in need more fully. Maybe stop, smell the roses and look up at the stars at least once a day and night. YOU are a gift to the earth for the time you are here. Act like one! Enjoy being a blessing. Happy Advent, Merry Christmas, Happy New Year, and may there be a new Epiphany in 2025! - Love, Pastor Cindy




Finance Committee Report

HEALTH MINISTRY UPDATES

The Presbyterian Church of the Roses Health Ministry is invigorated with new plans to renew its mission to encourage health, healing and wholeness within our Congregation and our Community. Do you remember our monthly Blood Pressure screenings and "Ask the NP - Brown Bag Medication Review" the 3rd Sundays after worship? We will restart these services in January 2025. Maintenance of blood pressure at target goal is important in the prevention of stroke, cardiac events and renal impairment. Is your blood pressure in range? Often patients have questions not answered (or even thought of) in a hurried office visit with their Medical Provider. This will give our members a confidential opportunity to share their concerns and develop a list of questions to bring to their next visit with their own Primary Care Provider if they desire. It will also offer an opportunity to assess lifestyle factors and root causes of dis-ease that might be addressed to improve overall health and wellbeing.

Other upcoming plans are for a study of the beautiful holistic teachings and book by Gladys McGarey, MD: The Well-Lived Life - A 102 YEAR OLD Doctor's Six Secrets to HEALTH And HAPPINESS At EVERY AGE. I can't wait to share her amazing life's work with you! Her life and her wisdom are truly inspiring! Each of her six "Secrets" is divided into sections that guide learners in accessing their innate inner wisdom to release the "'physician within" on their journey to Health, Healing and Wholeness.

> You are here for a reason All life needs to move Love is the most powerful medicine You are never truly alone **Everything is your teacher** Spend your energy wisely

Other Health Ministry developments include: Revamping the First Aid kits in various locations throughout the Church campus over the next couple of months. More to come on this endeavor, but I also want to share that our Church is participating in an important safety measure through the California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) entitled: The NALOXONE DISTRIBUTION PROJECT. The goal of this project is to reduce the number of opioid overdose-related deaths throughout California by providing individual doses of intranasal naloxone free of charge to various qualifying organizations. Narcan is an opioid reversal agent that may be used to save lives of those who have been found unconscious with the suspicion of overdose on or around our campus. As of May 2024, we have stocked several vials of Narcan provided to us by DHCS in our first aid kits throughout the Church Campus. Because Health and Safety are related concepts in answering God's call to Care for One Another, our Church has convened a new Safety Team and has begun putting together a Safety and Crisis Management Plan. This plan utilizes Prevention, Mitigation, Preparedness, Response and Recovery strategies. The plan is currently in development at this time and will cover a variety of potential threats such as: Severe Weather/Wildfire/Earthquake, Fire, Lockdown, Active Threat, Suicide, Missing or Kidnapped Students, Death, Accident, Serious Injury, or Medical Condition, Hazardous Material Spill, Bomb or Suspicious Device, Homeland Security Advisory Systems, Civil Dis-



turbance, Spilled Body Fluids, Child Abuse and Neglect, Communicating During a Crisis, and Pandemic Illness Response. Current Safety Team members include: Pastor Cindy, Raven Duchscherer, Dennis Baker, Lindsay Olsen, Kristina Textiera, Connie Soldate and Al Ledwick. 






Each Sunday morning from 7:30-8, we broadcast a 30-minute church sermon on KSRO radio.


